9. Share with your Community Group a strategic next step to live as a follower of Christ in a world where you more and more feel dislocated?



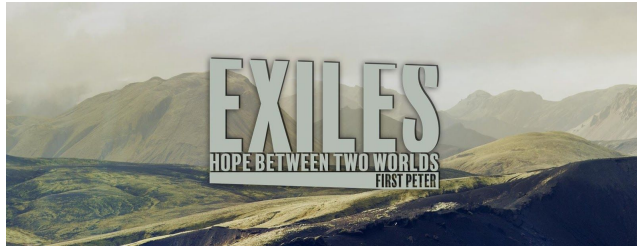
