1. What truth, verse or insight from last week's study of Nehemiah 2 has helped you?

SECTION I: READ NEHEMIAH 3:1-32

- 2. As you skim through **Ch. 3**, it can appear to be a chapter of repetitive descriptions. Go on a treasure hunt for unique observations or details, and jot down the ones that caught your attention.
- 3. What purpose do you think the author has in specifically recording the builders by name?
- 4. The repairs to gates in Jerusalem are mentioned in **V1**, **3**, **6** and **13-15**. Why do you think gates are emphasized in these scriptures?
- 5. The phrase "next to" occurred frequently in this chapter. Put in your own words what "next to" means in this context.
- 6. What can you imagine is also being built along with Jerusalem's walls?
- 7. Think of the communities you are a part of (spirituality, family, work, social, geographic, etc.).a) Share the benefits and blessings you've experienced as you worked "next to" others in that community.
 - b) Share the challenges and difficulties you bumped into as you worked "next to" others in that community.

SECTION II: READ NEHEMIAH 4:1-6

- 8. a) Summarize in your own words what happened in **Nehemiah 4:1-2** when Sanballat and Tobiah heard about rebuilding.
 - b) Who was listening to them?
- 9. a) What was Nehemiah's reaction in V4-5?
 - b) What was the people's reaction in V6?
- 10. Think about situations in which you have witnessed overt criticism or negativity.a) What do you think were the underlying motives or driving forces for that negativity?
 - b) Remembering the responses in **V4-6**, how will you respond to similar situations?

SECTION III: READ NEHEMIAH 4:7-14

- 11. Describe the escalation of this "external" thread in **V7-8** and **V11**.
- 12. a) In **V10** and **V12**, what's the status of the builders both physically and emotionally?
 - b) Why do you think God has included such detail about the exiles who returned to Jerusalem?
- 13. a) What "enemy" voices are threatening to undermine God's purpose for you?
 - b) How might you be unwittingly undermining people in your circle of influence?

- 14. a) How does Nehemiah respond to the threat? (See **V9**, **13-14**)
- 15. a) How do the builders respond? Summarize the changes they made in **V15-18**, **21-23**.
 - b) Why do you think the builders didn't just continue on in the status quo of V6.

16. From **V19-23**, comment on how increased community was built under increased threats.

17. Write a prayer request from your study of **Nehemiah 4**.

- 1. Based on all the challenges thrown at the Jews' leader, Nehemiah, what are some specific ways you can encourage the leaders in the communities to which you belong?
