What to Expect for WBS Sharing Class

At the end of class, we'll unite by asking for sharing from any of the tables. In order for as many women to participate as possible, we'll try to stick to a few basic parameters:

- a) all sharing should be tied to what was learned this year from "WOMEN OF THE OLD TESTAMENT"
 - b) it's preferred that only those who have done this Lesson actually share
 - c) the goal is to keep everyone's sharing to under 2 minutes per person
 - d) take great care not to divulge private details about someone else when sharing
 - e) anything that is said is to fall under the "G" rating
