- 5. a) Why do you think Joseph treated the brothers harshly and suspiciously in 42:7-21? b) What was the demand Joseph gave them in 42:19-20? c) How did Jacob respond to this demand and why?

7.	a) In ch. 43 what did the brothers tell Joseph regarding the silver in their sacks? b) What do you think this meant to Joseph?
8.	a) What plot did Joseph plan in order to reveal the hearts of the brothers regarding Benjamin? b) How did the brothers respond? c) What was Judah's argument for Benjamin and solution to Joseph?
9.	When Joseph exposed his identity to the brothers in ch. 45, what was Joseph's attitude regarding his years of humiliation and exile?
10.	Name a time when there was a distress or disaster in your life and share how God used it for His purpose.
