<u>Note</u>: **Psalm 106** gives a history of Israel's continual rebellion despite God's goodness. It was written as a declaration of national repentance when they were freed from their 70 year exile.

3. As you read **Psalm 106:1-6**, which expression <u>of praise</u> and <u>of humility</u> resonates with you and why?

<u>Note</u>: The Psalmist recounts how his ancestors had "done wrong and acted wickedly" (**V6**) during three distinct periods of Israel's history.
