

## Foster City Sermon Questions You Are Not a Paper Plate Genesis 16 May 14, 2017 || Donna Jones

- 1. Do you ever wonder if you are living a significant life? How do you define "significance?"
- 2. In Genesis 16, we read the story of Hagar. Who was she and how would you describe her journey of significance?
- 3. What did God ask Hagar in vs. 7-8? Why is this significant?
- 4. The angel of the Lord spoke to Hagar and told her she would bear a son (Ishmael) He also described to her what he would be like. How does Hagar respond? (vs. 13) Why is this significant?
- 5. Donna mentioned that we tend to define ourselves by *where* we are in life, i.e. single mom, divorced, student, business person, etc. And then she said, "*Where* you are (temporary) is NOT *who* you are (permanent)." And who you are *determines* how you live.

  Are you living as if God SEES you? How so? How can that be a struggle?
- 6. We often talk about the importance of getting to *know God*. Where would you say you are (on a scale of 1-10) with knowing and experiencing the fact that God knows YOU? Can you tell him the deepest cries of your heart?
- 7. Psalm 116:2 says, "The Lord bends low *to hear* the prayers of His people." How convinced are you that God really hears you, no matter what the circumstances? (Your prayers, your thoughts, and your intentions even though you might not *feel* like He is listening)
- 8. Hagar, who by human standards was a "nobody" and a slave, came to believe that God really valued her- it certainly was a process. What has your process been like in coming to believe that God values you?
- 9. Would you say you are living, on a daily basis, according to *who you are?* How can we pray for you along these lines?
