	Instructional Note: Midian was the fourth named son of Abraham by Keturah (Genesis 25:2; I Chronicles 1:32). The Midianites were probably descendants of Midian who lived south and east of Palestine in the desert north of the Arabian peninsula. This land borders the eastern arm of the Red Sea on either side.
