6. How did Moses respond to this verbal attack by the foremen? Give the verses.

7. What was God's reply to Moses based on 6:1–5? Be thorough.

8. a) What was the history God gave Moses in 6:2–5? Why is this important?

b) Share your history with God (events, people, etc.).
