- 2. Name the specific instructions given to Moses regarding the Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread from 12:1–20; 24–27.
- 3. a) Describe the attitude of Pharaoh and the Egyptians toward Moses and the Israelites in 12:31–36.
 - b) How is 12:31–36 and 12:40–42 a fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham (see Genesis 15:12–16)?
 - c) What promise are you waiting for God to fulfill for you (are you sure it is a promise of God—verify that in Scripture)?
- 4. a) According to 13:1–16, what did God command Moses to consecrate back to the Lord? Why?

- b) What do you <u>think</u> this looked like in reality?
- c) What do you consecrate to the Lord and how has this looked in reality?
- 5. a) What route did the Israelites take according to 12:37 and 13:17–20?
 - b) According to your map, was this the shortest route?
 - c) Who did they take with them according to 13:19? Why?
 - d) Who was the true leader of this exodus based upon 13:17–22 and how did He lead?
- 6. In a short summation, describe the scene at the Red Sea (14:1–31). Describe the conditions, the attitudes of all parties involved, and the outcome.

7. Write a song/poem to the Lord (like Moses and Miriam in 15:1–21) about what the Lord did for Israel.
