6. For the following questions, read Matthew 3:1–6, 11 and Luke 1:5–17, 26–37.
- a) In John 1:6, who is John?
- b) What is his job?
- c) What is the expected result of John’s work in John 1:7?

7. a) Why do you **think** the world did not recognize “the true light” (John 1:9–11)?
- b) In what areas of your life do you fail to recognize or receive the true light? Will you bring this up during prayer and sharing time with your group?
8. a) In order to be given the right to become children of God, what conditions must we meet?
- b) What do you **think** it means to be born of God?

9. What is startling about the phrase, “The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us”?
