	c) What issues or questions do the verses in Zechariah II:16–17 above bring up for you?

	b)	Why is it important that the good shepherd "lay down his life for the sheep"?
	c)	In your own words, describe how well Jesus knows his sheep.
	d)	Why do you think it is so important that Jesus know His sheep in this way?
6.	a)	Who do you <u>think</u> Jesus' own sheep are?
	b)	How do the sheep respond to the good shepherd, versus strangers and thieves and robbers? Give verses.
