 - c) What is the difference between a good or clear conscience and a conscience seared with a hot iron?
- 4. a) According to V3a, what do the false teachers forbid?
 - b) In **V3b**, how does Paul describe the things that have been forbidden?

- 5. a) What truth is stated in **V4**?
 - b) Why is everything that God created good (V5)? See also James 1:17.
- 6. Is there a rule, practice, or tradition not commanded by God that you are tempted to cling to? What is it and why do you hold on to it?

SECTION II: Read 1 Timothy 4:6-8

- 7. a) From **V6-7**, what things does one have to do and not do in order to be a good minister of Christ Jesus?
 - b) Why is training for Godliness better than physical training, according to V8?
 - c) Make an assessment of how much of your time you spend training yourself to be Godly as opposed to physical training? What is one practical step you can take to train yourself for Godliness?
