What to Expect for WBS Sharing Class

Sharing Class at WBS is set apart to look back and recount the nuggets of truth you've held dear and hopefully lived off of throughout the year. It's a time to share these nuggets with other WBS women in a condensed, succinct way. In order to aid you in that goal, we've created six questions in this last Lesson. At the very end of class, we'll unite by asking for sharing from any of the tables. In order for as many women to participate as possible, we'll try to stick to a few basic parameters:

- a) all sharing should be tied to what was learned this year from "PAUL TO A T"
- b) it's preferred that only those who have done this Lesson actually share
- c) the goal is to keep everyone's sharing to under 3 minutes per person
- d) take great care to not divulge private details about someone else when sharing
- e) anything that is said is to fall under the "G" rating
