8. a) Verses 18—21 are concerning which group of people hearing the gospel and rejecting it?

b) Who is Paul talking about in verses 19—20?

c) According to verse 21, why did Israel not believe?

10. Name someone for whom you long to know Jesus Christ. Have you given up on that person? Why should you or should you not give up according to verse 21?
