## Lesson Twenty Five: Romans 12:9–21

In this section Paul is still addressing how believers are to offer themselves as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God (Rom. 12:1). Verses 9–21 address how we are called to treat one another.

  - c) How does the last part of verse 9, *Hate what is evil; cling to what is good,* reflect sincerity?

c) How will you behave differently towards this person in order to be sincere? (Let this question become a true application of God's Word.)

- 8. If you have someone who truly wants to harm you and hurt you, what command and hope do you receive from verse 19?
- 9. Even though we don't seek revenge, this doesn't mean we do nothing. Explain what verses 20—21 would look like in modern day living as a positive expression of love to an enemy?
