- 1. Describe a difficult decision where you tried hard to balance both justice and mercy. How did you end up resolving it?
- 2. What do you think Joseph was feeling when he found out Mary was pregnant? How was Joseph trying to be both lawful and merciful?
- 3. How did Joseph stand against the stigma of sin? What can we learn and apply when we study Joseph's obedience?
- 4. What does the name Jesus mean? What does it mean to you when you consider the three names given to Jesus in this passage: <u>King</u>, <u>Savior</u> from my sins and <u>Emmanuel</u>?
- 5. In particular why is Emmanuel such a radically different concept from what is taught in Greek philosophy and Islam?
- 6. What is the only explanation for God becoming Emmanuel? What does it mean to move into solidarity with sinners?
- 7. In what specific place in your sphere of influence can love take a better form that takes concrete action? What next step might God be calling you to take to exercise this kind of obedient love in your sphere of influence?
- 8. How might love take a form that takes concrete action inside your community group, and also outside your group as you consider ways to serve your surrounding community together?
