

It's a job to be Job—Kids' Lesson #2  
Job 1:4-5, Isaiah 38:19

**HOOK:** Does everyone in your family have some sort of job to do? Maybe you help set the table. Or, perhaps you keep your room clean or help entertain your younger brother or sister. *(Give the kids a few minutes to share about their chores or a way they are a help to their family.)* Did you know that one of your “jobs” is also to obey your parents and honor them?

As you know, your parents do a lot for you! For example, they take care of you by giving you food to eat and clothes to wear. They comfort you when you are sad or hurt and they do their best to make you feel safe and loved.

**BOOK:** But the Bible tells us that parents do something else: they tell their children about God's faithfulness. **Isaiah 38:19b** says, “...parents tell their children about **Your faithfulness.**”

**LOOK:** You can learn a lot about the Lord from your parents. Just like we are learning from God's Word, your moms—right this very minute—are being taught God's Word today too! Your moms love you and want you to know about God and that He is...

- faithful to help you live in a right way.
- faithful to love and comfort you.
- faithful to always be with you and never leave you.
- faithful to prepare a place for you in Heaven....

We can trust Him because He is good and He is faithful. Ask your mom today about God's faithfulness and listen to what she tells you.

There are many parents in the Bible who prayed to have children. If their child became sick they prayed for him/her to be healed. We learn in the book of Job that Job cared about his children's choices and how they lived. He wanted them to have a right relationship with God and he came to the Lord on his children's behalf.

**TOOK:** I have a little assignment for you. Today, after Bible Study, maybe while you drive home or eat lunch, ask your mom to tell you what she learned about God today. Listen as she tells you and then tell her what you learned: **God is faithful.** *(Do a brief role-play with one of the kids. Act out them asking their mom about God's faithfulness.)*

Prayer: “Dear Lord, thank you for my mom. Help her to tell me more about your faithfulness and help me to remember what she tells me so that I will know You better. Amen.”

**Memory Verse:** “...parents tell their children about Your faithfulness.” Isaiah 38:19b



**Parent/Child Activity:** As you and your child travel in the car or go about your day together, tell him a brief, true story from your life that illustrates God’s faithfulness. Whether you are new to the Christian faith or you have been walking with God for many years, you can give testimony of the Lord’s goodness and faithfulness. Your child may even be able to tell you how God has been faithful in his life (or you can point it out to him)! This interaction will be an encouragement to both of you as you take time to talk about the Lord and His faithfulness together.



**Daily Prayer:** “Dear Lord, thank you that you love to use parents to teach their children about Your faithfulness. Help us all to recognize how faithful You are in our lives. Amen.”
