- 3. In these verses Jesus shows his love and concern for different types of people: (1) His disciples, and (2) The demoniacs. What do we learn about Jesus' care and concern for people here?
- 4. What does it mean that people try to keep Jesus at a "safe distance" in their lives? How have you been keeping Jesus at a "safe distance" (consider your family life, career, financial security, and/or your church involvement)?
- 5. What steps do you need to take this week in order to allow Jesus to have authority in your life and submit to Him?

- 1. What do you find to be the most fascinating aspect of Jesus calming the storm (v.23-27)? Why?
- 2. Why does Jesus question the fear of the disciples? Should they not have been afraid?
- 3. Through the leper (v.1-4) and the centurion (v.5-13), how has Matthew described faith in chapter eight?
- 4. In light of your answer to the question above, what was lacking in the faith of the disciples (v.26)?
- 5. What is significant about the declaration of the demons that Jesus is the "Son of God" (v.29)?
- 6. Why do you think the town people asked Jesus to leave?
- 7. What did you learn about the character Jesus from reading these two stories?
- 8. How can you apply what you learned to your life this week?
