- 5. How might your community group encourage you to walk by faith and not by sight in some specific area of your life?
- 6. Read verses 32-34. Why do you think religious people can often be the most blind to spiritual things? What is it that spiritually blind people lack?
- 7. Dan mentioned that scripture should comfort the afflicted and afflict the too comfortable. Do you see yourself as afflicted? How does this passage comfort you?
- 8. In what area might God be calling you to sit in the wheelbarrow? What is both terrifying and exhilarating about walking in faith?
- 9. What is disturbing and comforting about praying the "Disturb us, Lord" prayer?

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
