

It's a job to be Job! Kids' Lesson #23
Job 40:6-41:34, Ex. 15:11, Psalm 104:1-3

Hook: Here is our word for today: Majesty. Majesty is a special word that describes God. It means great, grand, and glorious! It means power and authority. Majesty is a title used for a king. And God isn't just any king, He is *the* King!

Book: God loves Job, without a doubt, and Job loves God. But, Job, has become so sad and frustrated by how difficult his life is that he questions God. *Does God even care about me?* He wonders. *Does He see what I'm going through? Is God really in control?* God answers Job by asking Him some questions of His own. He asks Job, **“Who has given Me anything that I need to pay back? Everything under heaven is Mine” (Job 40:11 NLT)** That means that God is above everything and everyone! God is saying, “Do you think you are more powerful, more majestic than me?” He reminds Job that only He is God. Only He is King. Only He is full of majesty.

Look: If you ever think you or someone else is more powerful or equal to God, listen to these bible verses that talk about God's majesty. Try and picture what the words are saying as I read them: **“...God, You are very great; You are clothed with splendor and majesty. The Lord wraps Himself in light as with a garment; He stretches out the heavens like a tent...He makes the clouds His chariot and rides on the wings of the wind” (Ps. 104:1-3).** Wow! Did you picture God wrapping Himself in light, stretching out the heavens like a tent, making the clouds His chariot and riding on the wings of the wind? God is full of majesty. Let's remember that—especially when things aren't going our way!

Took: God is not only full of majesty and power, He is also full of love and goodness. For that reason, we can trust Him. What are some things we need to trust God for? *(Give the kids a few minutes to share. They may need to be prompted with: “Can we trust God when we feel afraid of the dark? Can we trust God when we're sad or hurt? When things are unfair?”)*

Bible Verse: “Who among the gods is like you, Lord? Who is like you—majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, working wonders?” Exodus 15:11

Parent/Child Activity: God is not only full of majesty and power, He is also full of love and goodness. For that reason, we can trust Him in all things. Ask your child what he needs to trust God for. (You may need to prompt him with things like: When he feels afraid of the dark, when he feel sad or is hurt, etc.) Then, pray together about what he shared.



Daily Prayer: “Dear God, You are the King! Everything under Heaven is Yours. Forgive us when we don’t worship You as we should and when we don’t trust You fully. Help us. Amen”
