Imagine the types of challenges or hardships a new church or ministry might face today when starting out, and list some ways you can take initiative to "share in their troubles" and support them.
b) What was Paul pointing out in V16 , and why was this significant?
 a) Paul recounted another great story of mutual support in ministry. Pick out some encouraging details as you read 2 Corinthians 7:5-7, 13 and 8:16-17.
b) Describe when you've seen or experienced something similar.

- 9. a) In 5 words or less, describe the acceptable sacrifices to our God from each of these verses:
 - Psalm 107:22
 - Psalm 141:2
 - Mark 12:41-44
 - Hebrews 13:15
 - Hebrews 13:16
 - b) To give sacrificially in any of these areas, what struggles do you have?
