Roots WBS Kids' Lesson #19 Genesis 32-33

Hook: Have you ever wrestled a brother or sister, your parents or a friend for fun? Maybe you tumbled around on the carpet together laughing, tickling and and having a good time together.

Book: Well, there's a strange story in Genesis about Jacob and how he wrestled with God! This wresting match wasn't for fun, though. It was serious and it was for a purpose—God wanted Jacob's attention. The Lord appeared to him as a "man" (actually it was a special appearance by Jesus!). They wrestled not on carpet, but on the hard ground all night long! Jacob had to keep focus on the One he was wrestling and somehow he knew it was God. Even though God could easily win the match, Jacob was allowed to pin Him down. Then the "Man" (God) touched Jacob and injured his hip. As the sun started to come up, the "Man" told him to let Him go. The Bible says: "But Jacob replied, 'I will not let you go unless you bless me." So the "Man" said "Your name will no longer be Jacob—for now on it's, 'Israel'; you wrestled with God and you've come through."

Look: Jacob kept trying to do things his way. He was sneaky sometimes and tricked people. God wanted Jacob to live life better than that! He wanted Jacob to trust and rely on Him and not on his own cleverness. Jacob was wise this time, though, and held onto God, begging for His blessing. For the rest of Jacob's life he walked with a limp where God had injured his hip—a constant reminder of his wrestling match with God. And God did bless Him. Jacob knew better now that God was with Him and wanted His obedience. The name "Israel" means "God rules" or "God-Wrestler."

Took: Think of what God has blessed you with. Family, friends, food, toys...but never forget, remind yourself often, that your biggest blessing is Jesus who saves us from our sins. He gives us a forever home in Heaven, He is always with us, always loves us. What a blessing!
