- 1. What are some of the tangible signs of the covenants in the Old Testament? How did God react when Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, the people of Israel, sinned against God? What were some of the outcomes?
- 2. Matthew prepares us to understand that Jesus is about to become the sacrificial lamb that was required for the atoning of sin. He prepares the reader by setting the stage in the festival of the unleavened bread or passover. Why do you think this would have been so significant for the original audience of Matthew's gospel?
- 3. Do you ever wonder if you would betray or deny Christ, if you were put in a precarious situation that might test your faith. Have you been in a situation like that? (i.e. serious illness, devastating loss, painful experience, physical threat)
- 4. This New Covenant is not between God and on of His creation, rather, it is between God and...God. (Father and Son) Yet it is applied to all those who eat of the bread and drink of the wine. (The Church) Yet, Judas takes the bread and drinks the wine. What must be required of the heart along with the taking of the bread and cup?
- 5. CPC believes that faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior is a prerequisite for taking communion. We also believe that it is good to examine our hearts in order to confess our sin and reaffirm that eternal life comes to all Christians through the shed blood of Jesus on the cross. The Lord's Supper levels the field for all Christians. It reminds us that we all need Jesus. How might you approach communion the next time you take it?
