

In your experience, what are some things that get in the way of being an effective witness?
Look up 1 Peter 3:15. What does this verse tell us to be prepared to do? How should we go about this?
Do you think there is a difference between being a witness and doing evangelism? Why or why not?
What do the following verses say about being an evangelist:
•Ephesians 4:11
•Acts 21:8
•2 Timothy 4:5
From these verses, what might the difference be between being an evangelist and being a witness?
Have you ever known someone with the gift of evangelism? How was that gift expressed?

How did Philip express this gift of evangelism in Acts 8:4-8; 26-40?
We know that Jesus called us to be the salt and light in this world (Matthew 5:13-16). In his book, unChristian: David Kinsman writes: "Being salt and light demands two things: we practice purity in the midst of a fallen world and yet we live in proximity to this fallen world. If you don't hold up both truths in tension, you invariably become useless and separated from the world God loves."
