Genesis 18-19

1. The question Kevin posed as he began today was, “Is there anything too hard for God?” He reflected it may feel obvious, but our answer to this question frames how we go about life. So how have you built your life to reflect your answer?
 - a. If your answer is not what you’d like it to be, consider asking God boldly to help change that.

2. In v.10 we see one of the reasons for God’s visit is to once more remind Abraham and Sarah of his promised child, why do you think God does this? And why do you think God waited so long to fulfill this promise?

3. In v.13 we see Sarah laugh in response to God’s promise, why do you think that is?
 - a. Thus far in the story is Sarah’s doubt justified?
 - b. What is your own response to Sarah’s doubtful laugh?

4. Following this we see God assuring his mercy for Sodom if he finds even ten righteous people within it. How did Kevin's view on this exchange, that the righteousness of a few can cover the wickedness of many, impact your view of sin?

5. Along with this, how does God's willingness to forgive Sodom for the sake of just a few righteous, impact your view of God's character?

- a. If this is true how does it change your view of Christ's work on the cross?
- b. If we are made righteous because of this (Rom. 3:22), how can we now turn and impact our communities and the Bay Area?
