4.	Read verse 7. The Hebrew word for "peace and prosperity" is shalom. What does it look like for you to seek the shalom of the community in which you live?
5.	What are specific ways you can contribute to the common good? How could you specifically pray for your city?
6.	Discuss this quote together. What does it look like to take responsibility for the city in which we live? "Jeremiah's timely advice in his letter admonishes the exiles not to pout, not to yearn for a lost golden age, and not to rage against their enemies. Instead he urges them to take responsibility for the city in which they live. In his words, "seek the welfare (shalom or peace) of the city where I have sent you into exile and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare (shalom) you will find your welfare (shalom)."
