On Blessing and Breaking

1. Discuss this quote in Kevin's sermon. "Jesus was executed by the state and it wasn't just for loving everyone. Jesus was leading a revolution, but it is a revolution that is entirely different and surprising, something different than expected."
2. In verse 34, Mark says that Jesus, "being moved with deep compassion because they were like sheep without a shepherd." What does this tell us about Jesus' kingdom in contrast to the world's kingdoms?
3. What might change in you if you were to imagine Jesus and the kingdom of God satisfying the deepest needs in you and around you?
4. Think about what you need to address in your own life as you look around and see all the needs around you. Now consider Jesus words to the apostles, "You give them something to eat"
5. Kevin said in his sermon, "Jesus' kingdom revolution is characterized by two words: Word and Bread. Why are these words significant for us to understand the kingdom of God?"
6. Then Kevin said, "Jesus' kingdom revolution is carried out by two actions: Bless and Break. Why are these words significant for us to understand the kingdom of God?"

7. As a community group discuss the following characterizations and actions of kingdom citizens and discuss how your community group can support each other.

- A. What would it look like for your life and ministry to others to be characterized by Word and Bread for those around you?
- B. What would it look like for your life and ministry to others to be characterized by the actions of blessing and brokenness for those around you?
